


asoline Alley is the second longest running comic strip in the United States, just after




the Katzenjammer Kids. Gasoline Alley was created by Frank King and first appeared in November 1918 and is still in print. The strip centers around Walt Wallet, his family and friends of Gasoline Alley. The strip started out in the Chicago Tribune as a one shot panel, like the one shown here from 1920. These corner comics of the newspaper were where Walt, Doc, Avery and Bill (Walt's friends) would discuss automobiles. Walt, a confirmed bachelor, became a father in 1921 when he found an abandoned baby. This child became Skeezix (cowboy slang for a motherless calf), grew up, fought in World War II, and is now a retired grandfather. Walt married after all, and had more children, P.13
