

The 2008 Centennial Model T Party celebrated the 100th anniversary of the introduction of the Model 'T' Ford from July 21 thru 26, 2008, headquartered at the Wayne County Fairgrounds in Richmond/Centerville Indiana. 938 Model 'T' Fords. more than 2000 participants from 45 states and nine foreign countries with support by approximately 1000 volunteers created memories for a lifetime.

The organizers developed a very expensive list of activities that far exceeded the time available to participate in all of them. There were ten tours (each would require most of the day), four of five one hour seminars each day, Model 'T' assembly competitions each day, gasoline alley for car repair, Ford Motor Company Displays, car judging on Tuesday, a food court, a beer garden and on 3 days a swap meet. We had to carefully budget our time from early morning to late evening to take advantage of those activities of most interest to us.
